No changes this month

The purpose of the SOFT Cap is to slow the rate at which a handicap can increase. The Soft Cap is triggered when the difference between a player's newly calculated Handicap Index and their Low Handicap Index is greater than 3.0 strokes. When a calculated Handicap Index increase is greater than 3.0 strokes, the value above 3.0 strokes is restricted to 50% of the increase.

The Low Handicap Index is the lowest they have been in the last 12 calendar months and is fluid as dates change.

7. Treasurer Report for August 2025

One of our busiest months for the number of competitions held, beginning with the Williams Cup played by the ladies and gents against the juniors. All fees paid by the adults being donated to the junior section with the gents paying for the trophies. This year £105 was raised.

In addition, we hosted the mixed Open, with 46 teams paying £90 per team so another successful day for our club. The raffle raised £177.50 each for the men's and ladies' charities and added to the fees received for the Mixed Land Salver boosted the charities by a total of £235.25 each.

The remaining competitions brought in £272 to the ladies' section this month with prizes paid out of £137.50.

The main outlay this month was for the payment of the County Competitions in 2026 costing £300, but providing competitive golf for a large number of the section in the Scratch, Haskell, Weston, Stearn, Jubilee and Cranworth teams. In my opinion a cost well worth it for the enjoyment and competition it brings.

With the back end of the season approaching, hopefully, the only major outlay will be the engraving of the trophies which we have again undertaken ourselves and thanks go to Sara for arranging this.

8. Update from Main Committee
