



HALESWORTH GOLF LTD - CODE OF CONDUCT

Halesworth Golf Ltd (the Club) is committed to providing an environment that is free of discrimination, harassment and intimidation for members, employees and guests. Members, guests and visitors are all reminded that an acceptable standard of behaviour is expected in all areas of the Club and course at all times and that upon payment of membership or green fees, all members, guests and visitors have given their consent to be bound by both the restrictions and penalties which may be imposed for any breach of the Club's standards or serious misconduct in failing to meet the standards set in this Code of Conduct.

The Club expects members and their guests, and visitors to the Club, to treat other members, guests and visitors to the Club with due respect in relation to verbal, written and social media communications. The Club wishes to draw the attention of all members, guests and visitors to the below –

All golfers must –

- Show the necessary respect to fellow golfers at all times, which incorporates; no shouting on the course, no misuse of equipment, no aggressive behaviour etc.
- Treat all players with the same respect, fairness and equality, that you would like them to show you. Treat everyone fairly and do not discriminate on the grounds of characteristics such as race, gender, age, sexual orientation or disability etc. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person and treat everyone with mutual trust and respect. If you see any form of discrimination, do not condone it or allow it to go unchallenged, and report to the Management team as soon as possible.
- Conduct yourself in a sportsmanlike manner
- Please switch mobile phones to silent on the golf course
- Please respect the Club's dress code, as set out below –

18 Hole Blyth Course –

Gents – Trousers or Tailored Shorts, Collared Shirt, Golf Shoes

Ladies – Trousers, Cropped Trousers, Tailored Shorts or Skort, Collared Shirt, Golf Shoes

The Golf Shop staff will monitor the standard of dress on both courses. Please note that we do not have a dress code for the Clubhouse.

- Do not engage in any irresponsible, abusive, inappropriate or illegal behaviour. Please alert a member of the Management team as soon as possible
- Avoid slow play – please let groups behind through if you are playing slower than the pace ahead of you
- Please always repair divots and pitch marks
- Please keep trollies and buggies outside of the white lines that are clearly marked
- Please rake bunkers once you have played your shot
- Please ensure that all players ring the bell on the 5h, to signal for the players waiting on the tee that it is safe to hit
- Please shout fore if your ball leaves the perimeter of the range or when on the golf course. Please also do not hit your own balls or retrieve balls from the driving range
- Please allow staff to take priority on the golf course

Please respect fellow golfers on the course and report issues to the Golf Shop as soon as possible by phoning 01986 875567 extension 1. Members are not required to marshal the golf course or enforce rules to other golfers.
