#### **4. Captains Reports**

##### **Club Captains Report**

**16<sup>th</sup> September 2025**

**Since the last Gents Committee Meeting on 20.08.25 –**

1. I continue to note the different players I play golf with throughout my second term as captain. This is to a) demonstrate the variance of players I join during my year as captain b) ensure I interact with as many members I can during the year and c) be 'visible' as captain to as many members as possible. Since the AGM I have accompanied **93** different players on the course. I continue to seek opinion about the club and course in general.

**2. Captains' duties this month have included –**

- 28.08.25 – met with Gerry J & Ben T re fixtures for 2026
- 29.08.26 – played in the Pear Tree Fund Charity Day
- 03.09.15 – captained the Gents team away to St Clements

1. **Gents initial Committee meeting** – very good start to the new format meeting. Joined by Paul Coby, Ben Brown & Chris Haslam (apologies from Danny Milne) as invited guests to engage with younger & lower handicap members. Decided on format of questions for Gents survey & new template for committee member nominations (blank rather than pre-populated). Issue with build-up of surplus once again discussed at length linked to fees & prize allocation.
2. **Handicaps.** As chair of the Handicap committee, I concurred with our handicap secretary Colin Hillier, that there was no need for the usual quarterly meeting as there were no issues that needed discussion.
3. **Finances.** We endeavour to upgrade our reporting system and make it more easily accessible and understandable to our members, on a monthly basis.
4. **Suffolk Golf Union** – I have been invited to make the draw for next year's five Suffolk County Competitions on 19.09.25. I have spoken to the Secretary of the SGU with regards neutral venues and been advised to bring to 2026 AGM for a further discussion and potential vote. I shared the data I had collated re home draw recipients dominating the semi-final places across all five competitions.
5. **Suffolk Past Golf Captains** - I will be attending the Autumn meeting, held at Halesworth on 19<sup>th</sup> September.

### **Junior Update August 2025: How do we Do It!**

- We currently have **98** junior members, 39 with handicaps, which is a fantastic achievement and growth is continuing. What have been the drivers behind this increase; well as always it is no individual action or person. Below is a summary of what we do, have done and will do to promote the growth of Junior Golf at the Club.
- **Friendlies.** Matches have been completed v Woodbridge, Bungay and Rookery with Rookery and Sprowston (home and away) before

the end of October. Seniors v Juniors v Ladies v Juniors Plate, Been running for 3 years with Juniors narrowly winning the recent match v the seniors by one hole. Juniors v Ladies 20th August.

- **Competitions.** It is vital we provide the juniors with their own competitions, and we keep them busy! In addition to the above we have, our Junior Open, Summer Texas Scramble, Summer Knockout, Order of Merit, Sweeny Cup, the Buxted Bogey, and the Williams Cup.
- **Fun Competitions.** We ensure all the junior members can participate in competitions and we have begun to run fun events on the 9 hole for those with high or no handicaps, lots of prizes, goodie bags.
- **Schools.** We have been coaching at Wenhaston Primary since mid 2024, have recently completed a 6-session program with Harleston Secondary and are part through a 6-session program with Bungay High.
- **GolfSixes.** This is a series of matches v local clubs for players with a maximum handicap of 37 or no handicap, played off forward tees in a 3-ball Texas Scramble format. Competing clubs are Bungay, Gorleston, Diss, Rookery and Dunston, and we are currently top of the 2025 table
- **Open Days.** These are open to local children and are run 2/3 times a year dependant on weather. Up to 50 participants, with parents, have attended, fun activities, drinks and snacks provided.
- **Coaching.** Included in the Junior Membership are coaching sessions. In 2025 these have been extended to 4 sessions on a Saturday and 2 on a Wednesday with the number of months extended to run from April to November
- **Facilities.** Compared to the other local clubs we offer a defined pathway for the juniors, progressing from driving range/putting/chipping to 9 hole to 18 hole.

- **Junior Fund.** The coaching sessions are funded out of the junior membership fees. The generosity of our members via Paul's Junior Fund enables us to provide many of the above.
- **Adult Competitions.** We have a very welcoming membership which has resulted in many of the juniors competing in the adult competitions with some success! Thanks are extended to the members who make the juniors feel comfortable on the course and clubhouse.
- **Support and Mentoring.** We have begun a mentoring program to aid the Juniors in getting around the course in a timely manner, etiquette and basic rules. On Saturdays we take those who are handicap ready around the 9-hole course to mark their card, once they have completed 54 holes, 6 x 9, 3 x 18 they will get a handicap.
- **Volunteers.** As stated previously our members and their families are supportive, and thanks goes to Neil Coby, Steve Ward, Joy Staunton, Corrina Thubron, for their time given in support of the development of Junior Golf. Apologies if I have missed anyone out!

- 7. Juniors Fund** – more clubs donated (thank you so much) recently and this fund continues to grow. (now over £2,500) This is to be managed carefully so Juniors have access to it over a long period of time. Junior club shirts are now available for loan - for those representing the club.
- 8. Charity** – I'm delighted that both the Dementia Day & Suffolk Punch Day were both successful events recently. Jeremy has kindly offered some of the proceeds of a forthcoming race night to my chosen charity the Suffolk Young Carers group.
- 9. Gents matches** – one match this month.
  - Away defeat (3-2) at St Clements but close matches overall.
  - Have one more match which concludes our season.
  - Gerry is liaising with clubs to set up next year's fixtures.

**10. Trophies.** – I will eventually find time to upload all the Trophy photographs to go alongside competition enhanced details.

**11. Greenkeepers** – pick & place remains available. Great to see the development of the new pond alongside the 1<sup>st</sup> on the Valley course. Also, the bridge below the 4<sup>th</sup> has made it much safer and dryer for members to get to the 5<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> tee boxes. Our continued thanks to Mark and his team for battling against very challenging conditions to maintain the course to such a high standard. Visitors feedback remains very positive.

**12. Halesworth Golf Pro-Am** – still liaising with Sizewell & some local companies identified re some sponsorship for planned event next year.

**13. Gents AWAY DAY** – unfortunately Stowmarket's committee meeting was cancelled so they cannot consider a tee switch until their September meeting, so difficult to see this now happening this year.

#### **A Seniors Committee meeting was held on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> August.**

At that meeting, decisions were taken to retain the ongoing system for prize fund allocations and the policy of treating all individual competitions off standard tees as qualifiers.

A lengthy discussion was held regarding funding for county competitions. As a result of the successful campaign from both the Parks and Beaumont teams, seniors' funds have taken a significant hit and will fall below the £2,000 buffer previously agreed. It was agreed that, to regain the buffer, prize monies for future Senior competitions will revert to an 80% pay out for all competitions. It was also agreed that the policy regarding practice rounds and refreshments for County competitions must be complied with in future. A proposal that practice rounds for away matches, a buggy for the team captain (where not provided) and tea/coffee for all matches should be adopted. No food or snacks will be paid for. This policy will be proposed at the next Seniors Committee meeting.

A suggestion that a Past Senior Captain's competition should be instigated was discussed and did not meet with approval, as it was felt that the field would be too small.
